DAVID PARIKH NAMED MELVIN JONES FELLOW

STANTON, CALIFORNIA – David Parikh has been named a Melvin Jones Fellow by Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) in recognition of his commitment to serving the world community. Named for the founder of Lions Clubs International, Melvin Jones, the fellowship is the foundation's highest honor. It is a recognition of commitment to humanitarian service.
